<p>The first International matches in Floorball were played in the 1987 between the founding nations Finland, Sweden and Switzerland. The first European Championships were played in 1994 and the first World Floorball Championships was played in 1996 ten years after the foundation of the International Floorball Federation (IFF), with 12 teams in Sweden. The evolution of the Events has been quite fast, with a maximal 24 teams participating in the final event in the WFC in Finland 2002, where we had a total of 10 TV games and first reaching the 100.000 spectators in a WFC in Czech Republic in 2008. Presently the Major Events are played with six regional qualifications and a final tournament with 16 teams.</p> <p>The growth of the IFF has been rapid and the federation today consists of 56 members from all the five continents. There are a total of around 295.000 licensed players and over 2 million recreational players in the world. Floorball is played on some level in close to 80 countries.</p> <p>IFF has been granted the membership of GAISF (SportAccord) in 2000 and received the provisional IOC Recognition in 2008 and the full recognition in 2011. IFF is also a member of the FISU, IWGA, IMSA and a fully compliant signatory of the WADA Code.</p>

4.4. Use of the Olympic Rings

At this point in time the IOC has not given the approval to ARISF to add the Olympic Rings in conjunction with the ARISF logo.

One should understand that the Olympic Movement is composed of three main pillars:

- The International Olympic Committee composed of 115 individual members, the majority not coming from IF's.
- The Association of National Olympic Committees, regrouping the Continental Olympic Committees (Africa, Americas, Asia, Europe and Oceania) who on their turn regroup the 205 National Olympic Committees.
- The International Sports Federations. Here there are three categories:
 - The IF's having their sports on the programme of the Summer Olympic Games, regrouped under the ASOIF.
 - The IF's having their sports on the programme of the Winter Olympic Games, regrouped under the AIOWF.
 - The IF's recognised by the IOC, regrouped under the ARISF.

All pillars, sub-pillars and even small NOC's are allowed to use the Olympic Rings in their logo. The only group that is not allowed to use the Olympic Rings in their logo is ARISF. Even if ARISF is created by the IOC.

4.5. Financial Assistance from the IOC

- ASOIF receives 520 million USD from the IOC/London Summer Games, over a period of four years, which is 130 million per year.
- ARISF receives 4.180.000 USD or 0,8% of this amount as follows:
 - The IOC is providing a direct support per annum of 25.000 USD per Recognised IF, which is 100.000 USD over 4 years. There are 33 Recognised Federations, which means that the IOC is providing 3.3 million USD to all Recognised Federations per Olympiad (period of 4 years) or 825.000 USD per year. Parts of it must be used for the fight against doping.
 - The IOC is providing a support to ARISF of 200.000 USD to distribute to each Recognised International Federation for sports development programmes. This is 800.000 USD over 4 years.
 - The IOC is providing an administrative support to ARISF of 20.000 USD per annum, which is 80.000 USD per 4 years.

4.6. Financial Assistance from the IOC Olympic Solidarity

The development and assistance budget approved by the Olympic Solidarity Commission for the 2013–2016 quadrennial plan is 438 million USD. In comparison with the 2009–2012 plan budget of 311 USD million, the new development budget represents an increase of nearly 40%.

Nearly all monies are going to World and Continental programmes to develop sports, mainly Sports on the Olympic Games. ARISF sports receives 0% of this amount.
