b) that the rules group shall be under a steering group consisting of the RACC Chairman Filip Suman and the RC Chairman Thomas Gilardi.

# IFF system on changing the Rules of the Game

## 1. The normal process for changing the rules of the games

The new rulebook should be changed in a 4 years rotation. The following milestones have to be set within <u>this</u> period:

# January 2008

Request shall be sent to all member Associations and all persons in the IFF bodies urging them to send in proposals, with a priority list.

## 29 February 2008

Deadline for sending in proposals.

## March 2008

Rules group meeting

Preparing a list of rules for testing and asking for test Associations

#### 18 April 2008

Dead-line to apply as test Association

# April 2008

CB-decision of test Associations

# Autumn 2008

RACC organizes a seminar for Interpretations of the Rules of the Game. All member Associations will be invited to participate on their own cost.

#### 15 February 2009

Collection of experiences

# March 2009

Rules group meeting. Proposals to the IFF CB

# May 2009

IFF CB makes final decision

# September 2009

New IFF Rules of the Game is sent to all member Associations

## July 1, 2010

The new edition of the IFF Rules of the Game becomes valid

## January 2012

Request shall be sent to all member Associations and all persons in the IFF bodies urging them to send in proposals, with a priority list.

## 2. The handling of important exceptions

The IFF shall always have the possibility to make necessary changes of interpretations. Proposals will come from RACC

The IFF should be the only official organisation who decides about the Rules and Interpretations of the Game. This will prevent the consistency and continuity in the World of Floorball.

The IFF RACC must have the competencies and acting as an international information centre for Rules and Interpretations.

Testing new rules is possible if RACC gives an Association or an organizer of a tournament the permission.

There can be exceptions from the rules in certain Associations concerning Game time, except from in the first divisions.
